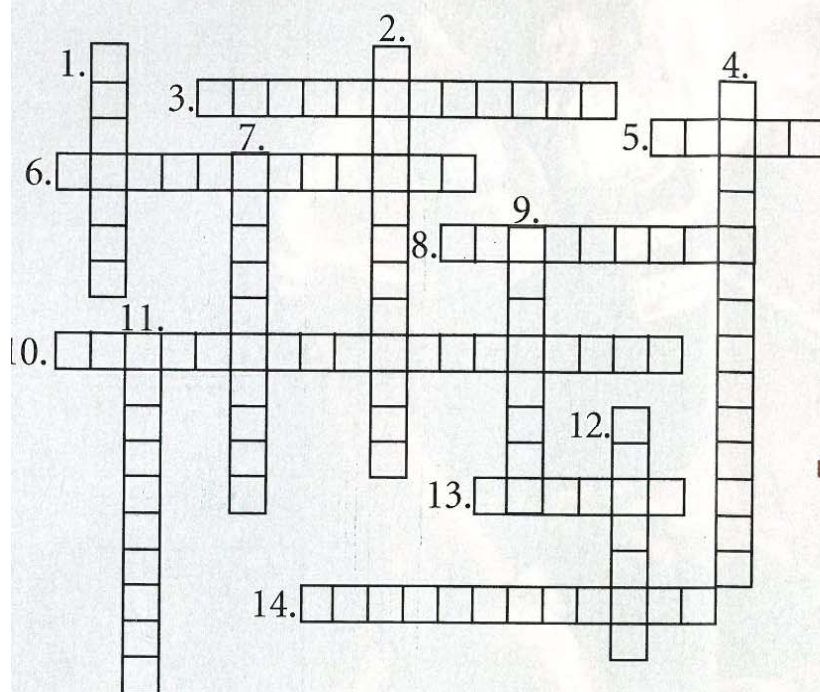

ACROSS

3. Best known as a racing breed but also used as a cross on other breeds for speed and refinement
5. Second-largest breed association based on annual registrations; color requirements
6. Descended from an English Thoroughbred named Messenger; gaited breed known for its lateral pacing gait
8. Color breed known for its spotted coat
10. These horses exhibit three natural gaits: a flat-footed walk, a fox trot and a "rocking horse" canter (Three words)
13. Favored Civil War cavalry mount; Comanche, lone survivor of the Battle of the Little Big Horn, was considered to have ties to this breed
14. Gaited breed brought to South America by the Conquistadors in the 1500s (two words)

DOWN

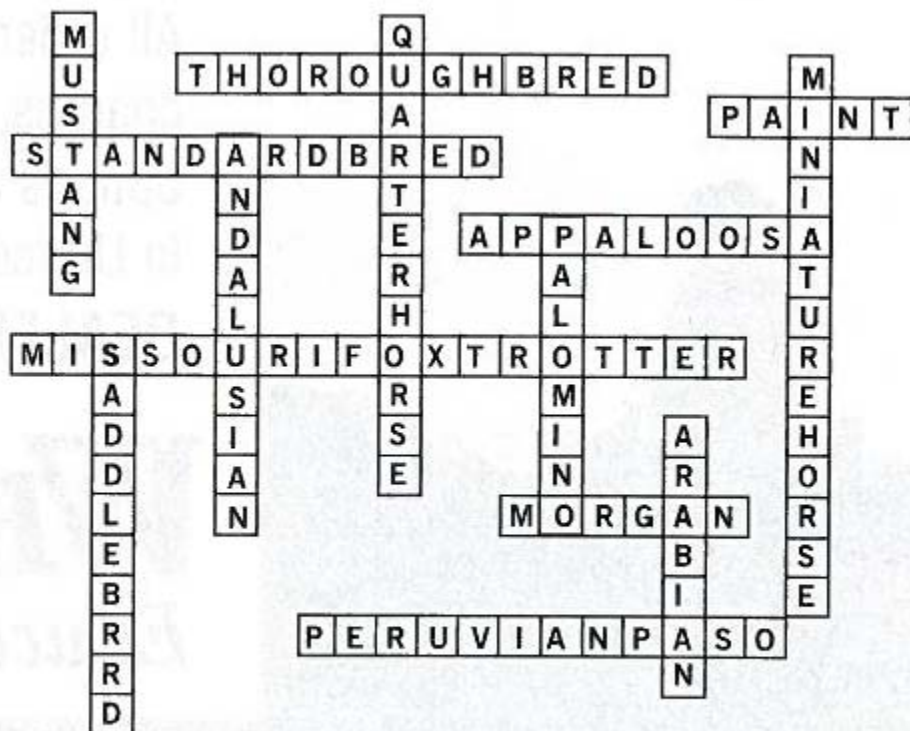
1. Hardy, free-roaming feral horse of the American West
2. Early foundation horses of this breed were often called Steeldusts (Two words)
4. Breed defined mainly by an animal's height; not recognized as a pony, but still a small horse (Two words)
7. Breed of horse named for a region of Spain called Andalusia
9. Breed of horse identified by its golden coat, white mane and tail
11. Originally known as the Kentucky Saddler; result of selective crossing of four breeds
12. Middle-Eastern desert breed heavily influenced by religious belief, superstition and tradition
